




Happy New Year Arrowman,

MESSAGE FROM THE SERVICE COMMITTEE

The Lodge Service Committee would like to take a minute to thank all

Arrowman for a truly outstanding year in 2021. We accomplished a lot this
year and it really shows around camp! One of the biggest projects that we took on was the renovation
of the ecology lodge, which turned out great and was a true honor to dedicate it to Bill and Helmi
Leffler. We wanted to share the following statistics from the year with you:

- ⇒ 160 members performed service out of the 231 active Lodge members = 70% of registered members completed service hours
- \Rightarrow 2,981 service hours were completed by 160 members = Average of 19 hours per person
- ⇒ 32 People earned service flap (35 hours +) which accounted for 1,805 hours of the total hours completed by Lodge membership = 56.41 hours on average each
- \Rightarrow Lodge Service Total and Overall Impact—2,981 service hours x \$28.54 (Current Estimated Value of each volunteer hour, April 2021) = \$85,063.47

We look forward to another great year of cheerful service from our brothers and will be sharing an overview of projects we want to complete in 2022 soon. 2021 LODGE YEAR IN REVIEW

- ⇒ 231 active Lodge members
- ⇒ 2,981 service hours were completed by 160 members at district/council events and council camps
- ⇒ \$4,000 contributed in materials and cash to the Council and its camps
- ⇒ Conducted 42 unit visits and elected 63 candidates
- ⇒ Welcomed 63 new Ordeal members,

\$\$ 2022 LODGE DUES REMINDER \$\$

The Lodge is now accepting payments for 2022 lodge dues for those Arrowman who **DID NOT** attend the Lodge Banquet in December OR **DID NOT** go through their Ordeal in 2021. Dues help the Lodge pay for programming, service, recharter fees, and much more. The number of dues-paying lodge members also impacts the lodge for national event quotas, Vigil class quotas, and more. Current lodge dues entitle members to wear a lodge flap, attend Lodge events, and buy lodge items, i.e. new Lodge Flaps.

For those that went through their Ordeal in 2021 OR attended the Lodge Banquet in December, their 2022 lodge dues have been paid. For all others, the 2022 Lodge dues are \$25 until March 31, 2022 and can be paid at 91bsa.org/oadues. After March 31st, a \$10 late fee will be added and they will be \$35. Don't delay, pay your dues now!!!
